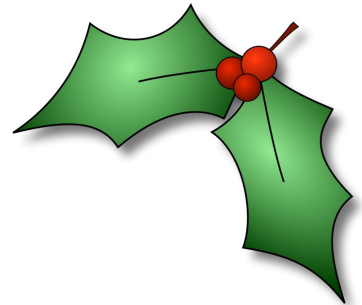

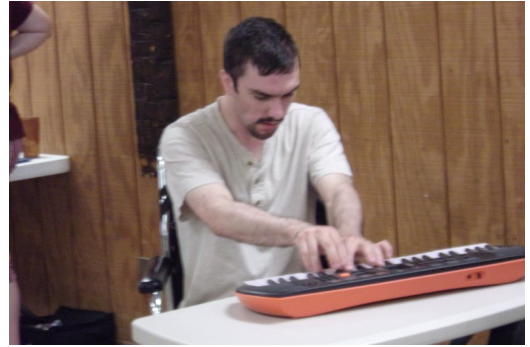
I've recently been reading a book by Michael Wittmer called Despite Doubt. In it he states that “Faith is not a blind leap, where we get ourselves in trouble and wait for God to bail us out. Faith means to commit to what we know, and what we know for sure is what God has revealed in Scripture. We have faith when we trust God enough to try new ventures, but we express just as much faith when we simply claim Scripture's promises and obey its commands.” Sometimes I've heard that faith is “a leap in the dark;” but this book helped me see that faith is based on knowledge and on the character of God, not on just anyone or anything. And I can count on Him and what He has said. Please pray that I will exercise THAT kind of faith each day.

Each December I try to share in the Bible studies I lead about the wonder of the Christmas story. Because it is the truth from God, there are many lessons we can learn from each character in the account. We looked at whomever the participants could remember in the story, and gained some insight for our own lives. Please pray that we will become more like Jesus as we study Him and His desire for our lives.



I've had the privilege of visiting Kenny and Jonathan this Fall. Both are blind. I was able to pass on a resource that contained the New Testament on a solar powered little device to Jonathan so he could listen to it with only a little effort.
